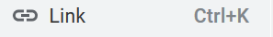
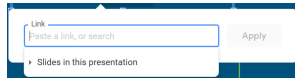


Vocabulary

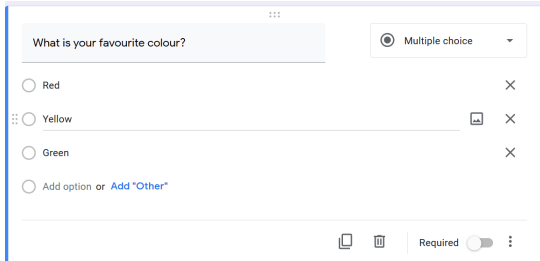
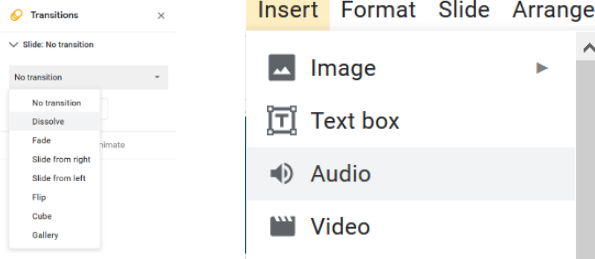
Transitions	The change from one image in a slide show to the next.
Hyperlink	Also known as a link or web link, a hyperlink is an icon, graphic or text in a document that links to another file or object.
Presentation	A collection of individual slides that contain information on a topic.
Audio	Sound especially when recorded, transmitted, or reproduced.
Video	A recording, reproducing or broadcasting of moving visual images.
Data Handling	Gathering and recording information and presenting it in a meaningful way.
Form	A document which collects data on a specific question or topic.
Field	The groups data is organised into, e.g. name, gender or height.
Classify	Arrange data in categories according to shared characteristics.
Database	A computerised system that makes it easy to search, select and store information.
Line Graph	A line graph is used to display information which changes over time.
Pie Chart	A circular chart divided up into segments which each represent a value.

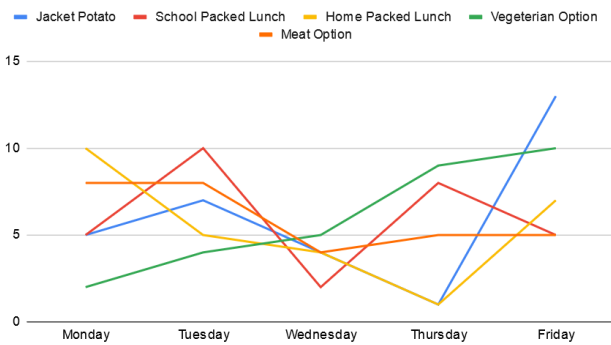
