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| Strengths | Strengths are tasks or actions you can do well. |
| Personal qualities | Personal qualities are personal characteristics of an individual. They are what make up one's personality. |
| Unique | Being the only one of its kind; unlike anything else. |
| Similarities/differences | A similarity is a sameness or likeness. When you are comparing two things — physical objects, ideas, or experiences — you often look at their similarities and their differences . Difference is the opposite of similarity . |
| Private parts | Those parts of your body which are covered by underwear. |
| Penis | The male part of the body which is used in reproduction. |
| Testicles | The part of a males body which produces sperm. |
| Vagina | An opening inside the female body which is for reproduction, menstruation and childbirth. |
